B. Summary of Leadership Yuva Connect:

1. **Vision of Viksit Bharat 2047-** The idea of Viksit Bharat 2047 is presented as a *civilizational mission* that goes beyond just achieving economic growth. It aims to make India a fully developed, self-reliant, and globally respected nation by the year 2047, when India completes 100 years of independence. This vision stresses that the country's progress must not only be measured in GDP or industrial growth but also in terms of cultural revival, self-confidence, and global leadership. It reflects a blend of modern innovation with deep-rooted Indian traditions and values.

2. **Panch Pran (Five Pledges)**- The five pledges, or Panch Pran, serve as guiding principles for this mission. These include: (1) making India a fully developed nation, (2) removing the colonial mindset still present in laws and institutions, (3) taking pride in India's roots, heritage, and traditions, (4) fulfilling duties and responsibilities as citizens, and (5) ensuring inclusive development where everyone progresses together. These pledges are meant to inspire collective responsibility and national unity, forming the moral and cultural backbone of the mission.
3. **11 Sankalp (Resolutions)**- Prime Minister Modi outlined 11 Sankalp, or national resolutions, in Parliament that further expand the Panch Pran. These include zero tolerance for corruption, women-led development, ending dynastic politics, respecting the Constitution, protecting reservations, promoting state-centric development, and building *Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat* by embracing unity in diversity. Together, they provide a practical framework for governance and social reforms to achieve the 2047 vision. These resolutions emphasize both ethical governance and citizen participation.
4. **Anchors of Development**- The document identifies six “anchors” that will support the journey to Viksit Bharat. These are Growth Engines, Atmanirbhar Bharat, Sustainable Development, Sashakt Bharat, Social Sector Reforms, and Global Stature. Each anchor focuses on a different dimension of progress—ranging from infrastructure and industrial growth to defence, diplomacy, and social welfare. This multi-dimensional approach ensures that India's development is holistic, balancing economic strength with social equity and international influence.
5. **Growth Engines**- Growth engines form the economic backbone of the vision. These include massive infrastructure investments such as an allocation of ₹11.21 lakh crore in 2025, economic reforms like GST and the Insolvency Code, and ease of doing business initiatives. Digital India has emerged as a transformational growth engine, with India becoming the world leader in digital transactions and connectivity. Renewable energy investments and nuclear initiatives are also part of this engine, driving India toward sustainable and resilient growth.
6. **Atmanirbhar Bharat (Self-Reliant India)**- Atmanirbhar Bharat is not only an economic strategy but also a call for national confidence. It emphasizes manufacturing “local to global,” resilience in supply chains, and schemes like PLI (Production Linked Incentives) to boost industries. Initiatives like *One District One Product* showcase India's diversity and local entrepreneurship. Space innovation, particularly the Chandrayaan-3 mission, highlights India's technological capabilities and inspires national pride. This pillar aims to ensure India is never dependent on external powers for critical needs.
7. **Sustainable Development**- Sustainability is given a central role in Viksit Bharat 2047. India ranks fourth globally in renewable energy capacity and has committed to achieving Net Zero emissions by 2070. Major initiatives include rooftop solar expansion, the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana, and nuclear energy development. India has already achieved two major UNFCCC and Paris Agreement goals

ahead of schedule, showing leadership in climate responsibility. The mission balances industrialization with environmental protection for long-term stability.

8. **Social Sector Reforms (Antyodaya)-** Social sector reforms ensure that the benefits of development reach the last mile, in line with the concept of *Antyodaya*. This focuses on GYAN—Gareeb (poor), Yuva (youth), Annadata (farmers), and Nari (women). Key achievements include 10.3 crore LPG connections under Ujjwala, 15.68 crore households reached under Jal Jeevan Mission, 5 crore houses sanctioned under PM Awas Yojana, and ₹3.7 lakh crore transferred under PM Kisan Samman Nidhi. The PM Internship Scheme also promises opportunities for one crore youth, highlighting investment in human capital.
9. **Women-led Development-** Women are positioned as central drivers of Viksit Bharat. This includes progressive reforms such as a ban on triple talaq, provision of 26 weeks of maternity leave, and 33% reservation for women in Parliament. Over 10 crore women are actively engaged in Self-Help Groups (SHGs), with a special focus on creating three crore “Lakhpati Didis.” Women are also making strides in the defence sector, with over 11,000 officers. The narrative positions Nari Shakti as essential for building an inclusive and prosperous India.
10. **Sashakt Bharat (Strong India)-** A strong India requires self-reliance in defence and national security. India has made progress with indigenous defence technologies like the aircraft carrier INS Vikrant, the next-generation stealth fighter AMCA, and the BrahMos missile system. Military modernization and operations against terrorism showcase India’s strategic strength. At the same time, India has positioned itself diplomatically as a nation with zero tolerance for terrorism, gaining international recognition for its defence and security policies.
11. **India’s Global Stature-** India’s transformation on the global stage is remarkable. Once considered a third-world, aid-dependent country, India is now a donor nation supporting over 150 countries. Its diaspora has grown in influence, with Indian-origin leaders heading global organizations and governments. India’s diplomatic role, technology achievements, and healthcare initiatives have enhanced its status as a trusted global partner. The goal is for India to evolve into a true *Vishwa Mitra*—a global friend and leader by 2047.
12. **Role of Youth in Nation-Building-** Finally, the role of youth is emphasized as crucial in achieving this vision. The document calls on young people to take ownership, contribute ideas, and lead innovations. The youth are encouraged to treat this mission as a *Jan Bhagidari Andolan*—a people’s movement for national progress. By participating in entrepreneurship, technology, leadership, and social service, the younger generation can ensure that the dream of Viksit Bharat 2047 is realized not just by governments but by citizens themselves.

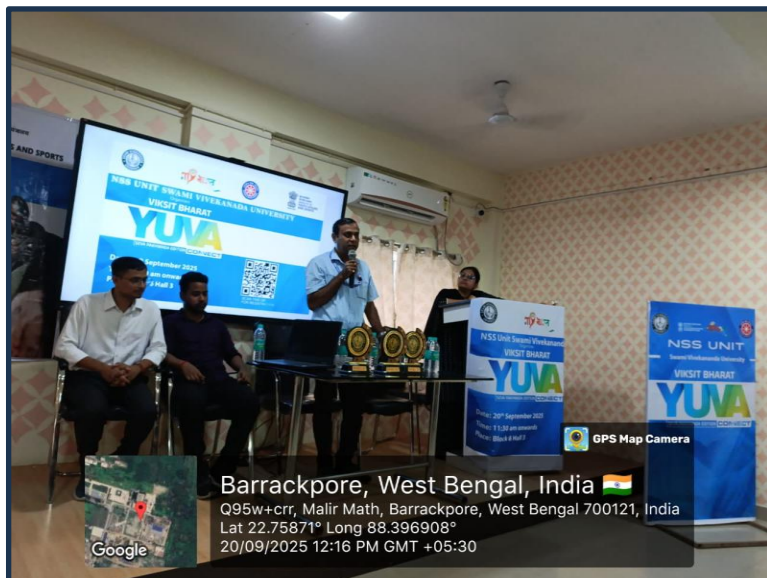
