School Eye Screening Outreach at Haraprasad Shastri School, Shyamnagar

The Department of Optometry, Swami Vivekananda University, organized a School Eye Screening Camp on 2nd and 3rd January at Haraprasad Shastri School, Shyamnagar. The camp was conducted as part of the department's community outreach and preventive eye care initiatives, with the objective of promoting visual health and early identification of eye-related problems among school-going children.

A total of 177 students from the school participated in the two-day screening program. Each student underwent systematic eye examinations focusing on visual acuity assessment and preliminary ocular health evaluation. The initiative aimed to detect refractive errors, visual strain, and other common eye conditions that could adversely affect academic performance and overall well-being if not addressed at an early stage.

Dr. Prabirendranath Sinha, Assistant Professor, Department of Optometry, played a key role in planning and supervising the overall screening activities across both days. He ensured that standard optometric screening protocols were followed and maintained the quality and accuracy of clinical assessments. His supervision contributed significantly to the smooth and organized execution of the camp.

Arup Saha, Assistant Professor, Department of Optometry, actively participated in conducting visual acuity tests and preliminary screenings of students. He assisted in identifying students who required further detailed eye examinations and provided guidance regarding the importance of follow-up care, thereby supporting early intervention measures.

Sourav Karmakar, Assistant Professor, Department of Optometry, was involved in hands-on vision screening and student interaction. He addressed complaints related to visual discomfort and educated students on good eye care practices, including maintaining proper reading distance and minimizing eye strain during prolonged study hours.

She ensured that students were examined in a systematic and comfortable manner, creating a student-friendly environment that facilitated effective screening and data management.

Srimanti Sarkar, Assistant Professor, Department of Optometry, participated in visual assessments and provided basic eye health counseling to students. She emphasized the importance of early detection of visual problems and explained how timely correction can significantly enhance learning ability and classroom performance.



Sourashree Mondal, Teaching Assistant, Department of Optometry, supported the screening process by assisting faculty members during eye examinations and managing student coordination. She also contributed to eye health awareness by guiding students on proper posture, adequate lighting, and responsible screen usage, reinforcing preventive eye care practices.

Anusuya Das, Assistant Professor, Department of Optometry, contributed extensively to both screening and awareness activities during the camp. She interacted with students and school authorities to highlight the importance of regular eye check-ups and preventive eye care practices. Her involvement strengthened the educational and outreach impact of the program.

The school authorities of Haraprasad Shastri School, Shyamnagar, extended full cooperation during the two-day camp, enabling the smooth conduct of screening activities. Students identified with potential visual problems were advised to undergo comprehensive eye examinations and appropriate corrective measures.

Overall, the School Eye Screening Camp conducted on 2nd and 3rd January was a successful outreach initiative. It facilitated early identification of visual issues among school children and reaffirmed the Department of Optometry's commitment to community service, preventive healthcare, and social responsibility.
