## REPORT ON FREE EYE CAMP AND PHYSIOTHERAPY CAMP

The Department of Optometry and Physiotherapy, Swami Vivekananda University, successfully organized a Free Eye Camp and Physiotherapy Camp on 11th February 2026 in collaboration with Patanjali Yog Nirog Kendra under the guidance of Mr. Prabirendranath Sinha, Mr. Arup Saha, Ms. Shreyashi Mahata, and Mr. Manas Chakraborty. The primary objective of the camp was to extend accessible and preventive healthcare services to the community while creating awareness about eye health, musculoskeletal well-being, and the importance of early diagnosis. The eye camp included comprehensive vision screening such as visual acuity testing, refraction assessment, color vision evaluation, intraocular pressure measurement, and basic ocular examination to identify refractive errors and other potential eye conditions. The physiotherapy camp focused on postural assessment, evaluation of neck, back, and joint pain, musculoskeletal screening, ergonomic counseling, and demonstration of therapeutic exercises aimed at improving mobility and reducing discomfort. Yoga-based wellness guidance was also provided in association with Patanjali Yog Nirog Kendra to promote a holistic approach to health. The camp witnessed enthusiastic participation from local residents across different age groups, many of whom benefited from early detection and professional consultation. Students of the respective departments actively participated in registration, preliminary screening, and patient interaction under faculty supervision, gaining valuable hands-on clinical exposure and community engagement experience. The program not only strengthened interdisciplinary collaboration but also reflected the university's commitment to social responsibility, public health awareness, and experiential learning through community outreach initiatives.
