## IRS Officer Ravi Kishan Edara Delivers Inspiring Lecture at Swami Vivekananda University



Kolkata, [09/01/2025] – Swami Vivekananda University (SVU) organized a thought-provoking session within its prestigious Guest Lecture Series, wherein they had the honor of hosting Ravi Kiran Edara, IRS, Com-

missioner of GST and Customs (CBIC), Govt of India, and Director General of the National Academy of Customs at Vizag. The session, conducted by the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, explored two interesting issues: "Importance of Critical Thinking and Creativity among 21st Century Youth" and "Media Regulations in India - What's the Way Forward?" The event was attended by a keen group of students, faculty members, and special guests who were keen to listen to Mr. Edara, a renowned public administration and policy-making expert. The session began with an introduction by the Director of the School of Humanities and Social Sciences and the Head of the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication,



who spoke about Mr. Edara's illustrious career. A ceremonial lamp lighting ceremony was then conducted, representing the quest for knowledge and illumination. Throughout his lecture, Mr. Edara highlighted the importance of critical thinking and innovation in defining the future of young minds. He challenged students to question established norms, be curious, and not be afraid to fail in the process of finding innovative solutions. His observations regarding media regulations in India also provoked thought-provoking debates, prompting students to think about the changing face of journalism and policy-making. The interactive session facilitated students to participate in mean-

Mr. Edara offered insightful remarks, reiterating the imperative for an education system that fosters independent thinking and flexibility. ### SVU Hosts Workshop on Television Production with Industry Expert Arijit Das



Kolkata, 13th January 2025 – Swami Vivekananda University (SVU) conducted a thought-provoking workshop on Television Production to fill the gap between industry and academia. Organized by the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, the session was attended by Mr. Arijit Das, Assistant Professor, Amity School of Communication, Amity University

Kolkata. With years of experience in sports broadcasting with ESPN and Star Sports, Mr. Das shared industry insights with students. The function was initiated with a warm welcome given by Dr. Pramiti Roy, School of Humanities and Social Sciences and Department of Journalism and Mass Communication Head. She welcomed Mr. Das, appreciating his contributions in the world of sports broadcasting and his entry into academia. Throughout the session, Mr. Das spoke about how television production has evolved, highlighting the importance of digitalization in contemporary broadcasting. He touched upon important points like camera placement and angles for live sports broadcasts, graphics and augmented reality usage, audio engineering for live commentary, and multi-camera coordination in production control rooms. Based on his experience at ESPN and Star Sports, he used real-life examples to explain these concepts, which made the session informative and interactive. Mr. Das also spoke of television production challenges such as the increasing pace of technology and changes in audience interests. He noted the growing prominence of artificial intelligence and data analysis in content creation and urged the students to be compliant with changing trends in the industry. The workshop ended with an interactive Q&A session, where students received worthwhile career guidance. The event was a valuable learning experience, furthering





SVU's mission of offering experiential exposure to the changing media environment.

Students actively engaged in discussions, sharing their perspectives and seeking advice on career opportunities in television production. Many expressed their appreciation for the hands-on knowledge shared by Mr. Das, which bridged the gap between theoretical learning and real-world applications. The workshop concluded with a vote of thanks by faculty members, acknowledging Mr. Das's time and expertise in enriching the students' understanding of the broadcasting industry.
