## **Narcissists and Ghosting**

Ghosting is a form of relational aggression where someone suddenly ceases all communication and contact with another person without any apparent warning or explanation and ignores subsequent attempts to communicate. Ghosting is often used to avoid conflict but it is fundamentally a destructive move, triggering feelings of confusion, distress, and humiliation in the person who is ghosted. Emotionally, being ghosted triggers feelings of vulnerability, doubt, and lowered self-worth. At a physiological level, ghosting depletes neurotransmitters, activates abandonment and rejection wounds, activates a systemic experience of loss, and activates the same neuropathways as physical pain (Krossa et al., 2011). To ghost someone is to make an intentional, self-centered decision to leave a situation in a manner that inflicts trauma and shame while leaving the recipient without a voice. In this way, ghosting is an act of narcissism. It is an act of discarding another, without empathy, completely ignoring the other person's feelings or needs.



Further, ghosting precludes an acknowledgment that the goodbye is what the ghosting person wants, blaming it instead on circumstances or the other person. It inherently distorts reality, allowing the ghoster to deny all responsibility for their behavior.

Interestingly, however, Jonason et al. (2021) found that while narcissistic individuals may endorse ghosting as an acceptable way to terminate a relationship, they may not necessarily be more likely to engage in ghosting behavior compared to non-narcissists. This finding highlights the complexity of human behavior and the fact that individual differences, context, and various other factors can influence whether someone with narcissistic traits chooses to ghost or not. Narcissists may engage in ghosting for various reasons, which are often rooted in their personality traits and desire for control and validation. Highly narcissistic people are motivated by their need for attention, admiration, and control. Ghosting can be a manipulative tactic employed by narcissists to keep the other person emotionally entangled, positioning the narcissist as the one who has control over the dynamic. The sudden withdrawal of attention and affection can leave the person feeling insecure and eager to please the narcissist, thereby boosting the narcissist's ego and sense of self-importance. Narcissists often avoid uncomfortable conversations, criticism, or accountability for their actions. Ghosting allows them to sidestep these difficult discussions and avoid taking any responsibility for the consequences of their behaviour

The Rorschach Inkblot Test was developed in 1921 by a Swiss psychologist named Hermann Rorschach (pronounced "ROAR-shock"). The Rorschach Inkblot Test is a projective psychological assessment with 10 inkblots on cards, designed to probe the unconscious mind. By analyzing responses to the inkblots, insights into an individual's social behavior, thoughts, and emotions emerge, often unveiling deeper, unconscious aspects of their psyche.



Thematic apperception test (TAT) is a Projective Psychological Test developed during the 1930s Henry Α. Murray and Christiana Morgan at Harvard University. Proponents of the technique assert that subjects' responses, in the narratives they make up about ambiguous pictures people, reveal their underlying motives, concerns, and the way they see the social world. Historically, the test has been among the most widely researched, taught, and used of such techniques. It involves describing ambiguous scenes to learn more about a person's emotions, motivations, and personality.










### **Talk Session**









### **Cancer Awareness Program**
